

HISTORY OF THE SERIES

The Southeast Super Trucks Series, LLC was formed during the winter of 2011. The Series' first race was ran on March 30th of 2012 at Anderson Motor Speedway.

The Southeast Super Trucks Series was developed to have an affordable touring series that local Drivers could run. The Series has incorporated a two tire rule which cut down on the cost. We do travel, but in most cases, you can be home in just a few hours. With the schedule that has been developed, drivers still have time for quality Family time and vacations. This series also provides a place for the up and coming young drivers to start, allowing them to fine tune their driving skills before moving into the next levels of racing.

The Southeast Super Trucks Series Inaugural 2012 season consisted of 10 races starting in March and ending in October. The majority of the races ran were 60 lap feature events at tracks in North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee and Virginia. The Series Inaugural season had a total of 31 entries for the season, with an average field of 16 trucks. We had 7 different winners out of the 10 races.

The Southeast Super Trucks sophomore season also consisted of 10 races, but the race laps were increased to 75 lap features at the same tracks as the 2012 season. The Series sophomore season consisted of 37 Driver entries with an average of 17 trucks per event. We had 5 different winners out of the 10 races.

The Southeast Super Trucks third year increased to a 12 race season with 75 laps of exciting and fierce racing. The competition for both Rookie of the Year and the Points Championship came down to the last race of the season. We had an average of 18 trucks per event with 6 different feature winners out of the 12 races. With our third season of competition, our driver roster increased to 44 highly talented drivers. Ages ranging from 13 to 72 years of age.

The Southeast Super Trucks fourth season continued to be a 12 race season with an average of 18 trucks per event. The racing was intense for both the Drivers and the fans. We had 5 Drivers racing hard to win the Rookie of the Year title. Of the five Rookie contenders, four finished in the top ten season points battle. It was a great season of competition, sportsmanship and excitement.

The Southeast Super Trucks Series is embarking upon the fifth season of racing. The Staff of the Series would like to thank all the Drivers, Crews, fans, sponsors, and race facilities for all the support that has been given for the past four years. We are very appreciative to each of you. The 2016 season looks to be a banner year with both new Drivers and new sponsors coming to the Series. We look forward to seeing you in 2016.
